INFORMATION FOR OWNERS & TRAINERS

BADGE ALLOCATION:

Every owner, partnership and syndicate is entitled to six owners' badges with lunch per runner. Registered syndicates may have up to twelve badges in exchange for lunch.

We ask that the syndicate manager agrees the allocation of badges under their management in advance of the meeting. Please be reminded that it is the responsibility of the syndicate or partnership manager to inform their owners of our dress code and specific lunch arrangements made on their behalf and in advance.

Trainers with runners on the day and jockeys with a ride will be entitled to two enclosure badges each. Owners of horses that are entered but not declared, can be offered two Richmond Enclosure badges for that day.

BADGE COLLECTION:

Badges can only be collected from the owners & trainers' desk at the Richmond Enclosure entrance close to Car Park 6.

Please present your PASS card or QR code confirmation from the PASS system. We reserve the right to ask for ID before any badges are released.

Please understand we will not always be able to accommodate late requests after this time.

Due to frequent sell out at Three Friday Nights, owner and trainers are eligible to receive four complimentary tickets only for attendees under 18 for these fixtures.

The Owners & Trainers' Restaurant is located along the Horse Walk, close to the Richmond Enclosure entrance. The Owners & Trainers' Pavilion

Situated to the right of the Parade Ring. It is an exclusive bar offering complimentary tea and coffee throughout the day and plays host to our race day winning connections.

Exclusive Seated Viewing

An owners and trainers' exclusive seated viewing area can be found at the front of the March Grandstand just below the Duke of Richmond's Box. Accessible viewing is available on request from the member's bar via the internal lift in the March Grandstand, or from elevated platforms on the rails just past the finishing line.

The Horsewalk – Syndicate and Annual Members' Lounge

The Horsewalk has been transformed into a bespoke syndicate and annual members' lounge. Racegoers can enjoy a bar and complimentary tea and coffee to accompany the perfect backdrop for all racing enthusiasts.

Owners are entitled to three Car Park 6 owners' labels per runner. These will be sent to the registered owner by post (from Weatherbys) prior to the meeting.

Please can we ask that gazebos are not erected in such a way that they block other car parking spaces. If spaces become too limited, we reserve the right to request they are taken down.

DRESS CODE

At Goodwood we embrace quintessentially British style – whether that's high fashion or something more classic, it's about a relaxed yet chic look. We are known for a distinctive style – linen suits, Panama hats and chic dresses are de-rigueur. Ever since King Edward VII relaxed the dress code in the 19th century, we have enjoyed a carefree holiday feel here, unlike any other racecourse.

Within the Richmond Enclosure

Gentlemen (and boys aged 16 and over) are required to wear a jacket, collared shirt and a tie to all 19 racedays. Women should wear smart attire, suitable for a day at the races. For the warmer fixtures think summer garden-party: a floaty, floral dress, or an elegant top and trouser/skirt combination. For the cooler racedays, dress for the

weather by layering up. A tweed jacket paired with boots is the perfect combination to keep you warm.

Children should also dress in smart attire. Boys aged 7-15 years are asked to wear a long sleeved collared shirt (no polo shirts). The dress code is not applicable to children under 7 years.

CHILDREN IN THE PARADE RING

Children under 12 years of age will not be allowed access to the parade ring. Children between the ages of 12-16 must be accompanied by an adult.

WINNING CONNECTIONS

Owners of winning horses will be presented with a trophy, a video in a card of the race, and a memory stick of images. They will also receive a celebratory glass of English Sparkling Wine in the pavilion, with our owners & trainers' representative.

SPRING RACING

OPENING WEEKEND

Friday 2 – Saturday 3 May

Our feature races on the opening weekend are devoted to fillies and mares, with two Listed contests restricted exclusively to them.

This year, the Listed EBF Daisy Warwick Stakes will be back on the Friday with the Listed Conqueror Fillies Stakes remaining on the Saturday. The former has seen some promising winners down the years, but none more so than Alpinista (rated 113), who was successful in 2021. She shot to frame in the Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and set the standard in recent memory.

Meanwhile, the Conqueror Stakes, which received a boost in prize money last year to £60,000 where it remains, is run for three-year-olds and upwards over a mile. Nyaleti won the 2018 renewal en route to claiming the German 1,000 Guineas.

MAY FESTIVAL

Friday 23 – Saturday 24 May

This year's May Festival features high-quality racing that includes three Listed races: The Height of Fashion Stakes, The EBF Cocked Hat Stakes and The Festival Stakes.

Friday hosts the important Festival Stakes run over one mile and two furlongs, worth £60,000 and won in 2021 by Lone Eagle who went on to finish second to Hurricane Lane in the Irish Derby. King Of Conquest was strong at the finish in 2023 before going on to be consistent in Group races across the season. The Height of Fashion Stakes alongside the EBF Cocked Hat Stakes are the features on Saturday. The former is run over one mile and two furlongs for £60,000.

The EBF Cocked Hat has proved a notable trial for the major classics, Lionel, Gregory and Meydaan are recent winners of the race. In 2023, Gregory ran out a ready winner before landing the Group 2 Queen's Vase.

FAMILY RACE DAY

Sunday 8 June

Family Race Day will host two of the most valuable races of the season outside of the Qatar Goodwood Festival. Worth £70,000 each, the one mile four furlong Tapster Stakes, provided King Of Conquest a platform last year to progress to Listed success following his win in the race. While the Listed Anges Keyser Stakes is a further boost to the day. Open to fillies and contested over one mile two furlongs, it was won last year by Lava Stream. The race was originally run at Newbury Racecourse and moved to Goodwood in 2023.

SUMMER RACING

QATAR GOODWOOD FESTIVAL PRESENTED BY VISIT QATAR Tuesday 29 July – Saturday 2 August

Affectionately known as ‘Glorious Goodwood’, the Qatar Goodwood Festival will be run this year between 29 July – 2 August. The eyes of the racing world will be firmly set on the Sussex Downs for our annual showpiece of high-quality racing and glamour in this most idyllic of settings. We would like to thank our sponsors, both new and established, for their support in making this a week to remember for all concerned, with particular thanks going to our title partner, Visit Qatar. We are delighted that the first three days will again be part of the Hong Kong Jockey Club’s World Pool with UK betting via the Tote.

Last year, Kyprios crowned himself the king of the stayers once again when landing a second victory in the feature race on day one of the Qatar Goodwood Festival. The Aidan O’Brien trained six-year-old recorded his fourth consecutive victory of the year, backing up his Group 1 success in the Ascot Gold Cup.

Godolphin tasted Group 1 glory in the Qatar Sussex Stakes on the Wednesday. Notable Speech cruised to victory under

William Buick to become the first horse since the legendary Frankel to complete the QIPCO 2,000 Guineas and Sussex Stakes double in the same season.

Ryan Moore continued his masterclass on the South Downs when steering Opera Singer to victory in the Group 1 Qatar Nassau Stakes, the feature race for fillies and mares on day three of the Qatar Goodwood Festival. The Coolmore partnership had already tasted Group success earlier on the card when Jan Brueghel won the Group 3 John Pearce Racing Gordon Stakes.

Day four of the Qatar Goodwood Festival guarantees a fast and furious thriller in the five-furlong King George Qatar Stakes, a race made famous by the sprinting superstar Battaash. Last year, Big Evs held off the Australian challenger, Asfoora, and won at the Festival for the second year running for trainer Mick Appleby.

The cavalry charge of the Coral Stewards’ Cup concluded a fantastic five days of racing on the Sussex Downs. The big field sprint handicap over six furlongs was won in 2024 by the Sussex trained Get It.

SEASON FINALE

Sunday 12 October

The final meeting of the season features several handicaps, the best of which being over a distance of one mile and four furlongs. The card also features three 2 year old races which provide the perfect opportunity to see horses that may prosper in big races in the following seasons.

The opening race of the day will again be a race over two miles but for jump jockeys. The Handicap often provides a spring board for National Hunt horses at the start of their winter campaign, in recent years the likes of Tritonic and Goshen have used the race to get their season underway.

SUNDAY 12 OCTOBER

All horses are stabled away from the course on racedays, providing a tranquil setting to give each individual time before a race to settle into their surroundings, alongside the privacy after their engagement. On course, misting fans, purpose built wash-down facilities, and a team of highly-skilled veterinary experts, ensure each horse receives the best possible end-to-end experience.

Continued investment in the racing surface, machinery and irrigation systems mean optimal going conditions are managed and maintained. British Racing is one of the best-regulated animal activities with 6,000 personnel employed to look after 12,000 horses in training.

- To engage with partners, suppliers, fans and members to become more sustainable through Goodwood demonstrating leadership.






THE COURSE
